#### Why Are there Racial Disparities in Homelessness?

A history of housing discrimination has contributed to the racial disparities in homelessness that we see today. Check out this quick video for more about this history. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=JKkteYKrR5E

#### How to Use this Dashboard

First, choose your HUD CoC and preferred Reporting Period using the filters. Then update the results.

The dashboard will display the overall rate of homelessness per 10,000 residents in your CoC. You can then compare this overall rate of homelessness with the rate of homelessness by race and ethnicity. If there are NO racial/ethnic disparities, all 'rate of homelessness' bars will be the same length, equal to the overall rate of homelessness.

To determine how much more likely one demographic group is to experience homelessness compared to another group, you'll use the group with the smaller rate of homelessness as the basis of comparison. Let's say the rate for White folks is lower than the rate for Black or African American folks. Divide the rate of homelessness for Black or African American folks (numerator) by the rate of homelessness for White folks (denominator). To describe the resultant rate: Black or African American folks in my CoC are \_\_times as likely to experiencing homelessness in the reporting period compared to white folks in my CoC.\*

#### Additional Detail about data included in dashboard:

- Total population counts from US Census Bureau Decennial 2020 Census Count
- Total count of clients experiencing homelessness comes from programs that record data in HMIS. These counts include clients served in emergency shelter, safe haven, transitional housing, and PATH, ESG and City-funded Street Outreach programs. It also includes clients entering permanent housing programs.
- For visualizations by race/ethnicity, clients reporting unknown race or ethnicity are excluded. Census data include a "some other race" category, which is also excluded from this analysis.


